



Selective Service Failure to Register Appeal Form Rev. 11/9/17

Most males from age 18 through 25 -- including permanent residents and other eligible noncitizens -- are required to register with the Selective Service. Anyone required to register with Selective Service must have done so in order to receive Federal financial aid.

- ⇒ **If you are registered**, submit a copy of your Registration Acknowledgement Card or your letter of registration to the Financial Aid Office. You may print proof of your registration online at www.sss.gov.
- ⇒ **If you are currently in the armed services on active duty**, submit documentation of your current status.
- ⇒ **If you are 18 - 25 years old and are not registered**, you must register with the Selective Service and submit a copy of documentation from Selective Service. You may register online at www.sss.gov.
- ⇒ **If you are a noncitizen who first entered the U.S. after you turned 26**, submit documentation of your entry date to the U.S.
- ⇒ **If you are age 26 or older, or born in 1960 or later and not registered**, you must explain below why you did not register. **This appeal form must be returned with a Status Information Letter to the Financial Aid Office.** You request this letter from the Selective Service either online at www.sss.gov or by calling (847) 688-6888.
Your explanation should include:
 - 1.) Where you lived from age 18 to 25;
 - 2.) Whether or not you thought you were registered;
 - 3.) Why you were not aware of the widely publicized requirement to register when you were 18 - 25 years old.
