
Here are some of our accomplishments






The WHCC Falcons beat Yuba College 24-14 to win the NCFC American Division Bowl and end the season with a 10-1 record.

WHCL's registered nurse program has grown significantly and boasts of the highest success rate in California for those taking the registered nurse license exam.




WHCC rodeo coach Bruce Hunt retired after 30 years as the winningest coach in college rodeo. Justin Hampton has taken over the reins.



Victor Davis Hanson was one of many distinguished speakers during the Essential Elements Series hosted by WHCCD.




Operation Awareness at WHCL allows students to learn about disabilities.
