West Hills College Lemoore (WHCL) was recognized by the Campaign for College Opportunity in their report, "Getting There: Are Community Colleges maximizing Student Completion of Transfer-Level Math and English?" WHCL is listed in the top seven California community colleges to offer more than 90% of our introductory math and English course offerings at transfer level. STRONG IMPLEMENTERS IN MATH AND ENGLISH

In the three regions studied, only seven of 47 colleges are strong implementers in both math and English, with 90 to 100 percent of introductory sections at the transfer level and fewer than 10 percent in below-transfer remedial courses.

STRONG IMPLEMENTERS IN ENGLISH

At an additional 13 colleges, 90 to 100 percent of introductory sections are at the transfer level in English, but not in math. None of the colleges studied is a strong implementer in just math.
